Types of care

Making the decision to move into a care home doesn't have to be difficult. We're here to support you every step of the way.

Residential care

At Harry Priestley House, we provide residential care for people with learning disabilities who can no longer live at home and need support throughout the day. It can help people to live safely, whilst giving family members peace of mind, knowing that you are in a supportive environment. We can accommodate up to 12 people with residential care.

We can support you with everyday tasks, from personal care to support in the community. We will help you with medical appointments, financial support or any other tasks of daily life that you may find difficult to do.

We also support people during the early stages of dementia, offer end-of-life support and care for residents with complex needs, such as autism.

Mobility support

The Home is well-equipped to support people who are less mobile to ensure you can continue to live as independently as possible.

We have two vehicles to support residents on trips outside the Home, for instance to attend local Day Centres. One of our vans is adapted to transport wheelchairs.

To help with mobility, we also have a tracking hoist and an assisted bath on the ground floor, as well as a fitted stair lift.

Additional Services

We work closely with external specialists to offer our residents additional care and services, including physiotherapy and occupational therapy.

A chiropodist and our mobile hairdresser visit regularly, to offer these services at the Home.
